2. Discussion regarding Resolution No. 1910, Calleguas Municipal Water District Annexation – Pleasant Valley Venture, LLC (Calleguas Annexation No. 100)\*

<u>Action:</u> It is recommended that the Board adopt Resolution No. 1910.

This resolution grants final approval of Calleguas Annexation No. 100. Located between Etting Road and Pleasant Valley Road west of Highway 1 in Oxnard, this annexation consists of 8.7 acres of vacant land and public right of way. Development planned by the owner includes 101 rental family apartments and a 70-suite assisted living facility. The Ventura Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) approved the annexation with Resolution 16-05 on September 21, 2016. Metropolitan approved it with Resolution No. 9214 on October 11, 2016. On January 11, the owner delivered payment for the Calleguas and Metropolitan Annexation Fees.

Since the Board last reviewed Annexation 100, the map and legal description were revised to include more public right of way. Otherwise, the proposed territory and

use are unchanged. Calleguas received annexation fees of \$20,313.81 and Metropolitan fees amount to \$45,091.71.

#### I. ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION

#### 1. Discussion regarding potential sources of supply for the Water Supply Alternatives Study

The recently-completed Master Plan confirmed that in a long-term (6 month) imported water supply outage Calleguas does not have sufficient local supplies to meet the purveyors' water demands, particularly after Lake Bard runs dry (after approximately 4 months). The Master Plan recommended undertaking a Water Supply Alternatives Study to identify potential alternative sources that would enable Calleguas to continue to cost-effectively provide a reliable water supply under emergency or shutdown scenarios when imported water is not available.

The Manager of Engineering will present brief background information about potential outages, available and planned water supplies, and the need for additional supplies. The Board will then be asked to brainstorm about potential supply sources that should be considered in the upcoming study. Similar brainstorming sessions will be held at the January purveyor meeting and two public engagement meetings (see table of upcoming meetings in the packet).

#### C. WRITTEN COMMUNICATION

 Letter dated December 21, 2016 from Susan Mulligan, General Manager, to Sam Unger, Executive Officer, Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board expressing support for a Camarillo Sanitary District / Camrosa Water District Proposed Recycled Water Interconnection Pipeline

The General Manager said that this letter expresses support for a project to connect the recycled water systems of the Camarillo Sanitary District (Cam San) and Camrosa Water District (Camrosa) to enable Camrosa to purchase excess Cam San recycled water and deliver it to growers on the Oxnard Plain. Regional Board approval is needed for storage of Cam San's recycled water in Camrosa's ponds. No action was taken.

The Manager of Finance and Human Resources presented and reviewed the financial statements. No action was taken.

#### 2. Review of the District's Investment Policy

The Manager of Finance and Human Resources said that the Board reviews and approves the District's Investment Policy on an annual basis. The policy has been reviewed by District staff and the Wells Fargo investment team and no changes are proposed this year.

On a motion by Director Blois, seconded by Director Santamaria, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to approve the District's Investment Policy.

#### G. OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE

#### 1. Video from inspection of Hueneme Outfall

The Manager of Operations and Maintenance showed a video excerpt from a recent inspection of the Hueneme Outfall. Although the seawater was less clear than it was during the previous year's inspection, the diffuser ports were determined to be structurally sound and flowing freely. No action was taken.

#### H. RESOURCES AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS

The Manager of Resources said that the recent storms have brought considerable amounts of rainfall to Northern California and that an atmospheric river condition is expected in the coming week. He stated that, even with all of the rainfall, the pumps in the Delta that deliver water south are still not operating near capacity so water has flowed out to sea and been lost.

#### I. ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION

#### 1. Engineering and Construction Committee Report

Committee Chair Blois summarized the discussion from the Engineering & Construction Committee meeting held immediately prior to the Board meeting. He said that they discussed the draft 5 Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and decided to review the CIP twice a year in an Engineering and Construction Committee meeting. No action was taken.

#### 2. Change Order Report for Q4 2016

The Manager of Engineering said that the change order summary for Grandsen Pump Station, Phase 2 (Project No. 500) was provided in the packet. All other projects in construction did not have any change orders to date. No action was taken.

#### 3. Approval of a new capital project: Calleguas-Ventura Interconnection (Project No. 562)

The Manager of Engineering said that the Calleguas-Ventura Interconnection (Interconnection) would provide a means of conveying water between the City of San Buenaventura (City) and Calleguas, allowing the City, United Water Conservation District (United), and potentially Casitas Municipal Water District (Casitas) to receive delivery of their State Water Project allocations by wheeling it through the Calleguas distribution system. The Interconnection would also provide a means for Calleguas to receive potable water from the City during an unplanned outage of imported supplies. The City is undertaking a study to evaluate alternative alignments for the Interconnection pipeline and determine the preferred connection point, pipeline route, and pipeline size so that they can proceed with California Environmental Quality Act

(CEQA) documentation. The study will also identify a potential site and size for a pump station.

There are three potential locations under consideration to connect to the Calleguas system:

- 1. End of 24" Las Posas Feeder at Price Rd. and Highway 118
- 2. 30" Las Posas Feeder at Somis Crosstie (Somis Rd. and Highway 118)
- 3. Springville Reservoir

The size of the connection will be determined by hydraulic analysis during the study, but it is believed that Calleguas could receive 5-10 cubic feet per second, depending on the location of the connection. Although this is a small amount of water, it could be critical under outage conditions, particularly in a lengthy outage when the limited amount of stored water in Lake Bard needs to be conserved. Unlike the interconnection with Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, the water would be available when imported water supplies are interrupted.

Due to the limited demands downstream of Springville Reservoir (Oxnard and Port Hueneme only), the third connection location is of lower benefit to Calleguas than the other two connection locations. Determination of the connection location is one of the earliest tasks, as the rest of the work is highly dependent upon that decision. Should the third connection location be selected, staff proposes to maintain the option of continuing to cooperate on the project but no longer contributing financially (see further discussion in next agenda item).

This initial budget covers Calleguas' contribution to and participation in the alignment study (see below). This was calculated as 30% of the costs of the alignment study, as well as staff time to participate in the work. United is contributing 30% of the costs and the City is covering the remainder. There is sufficient budget available in the construction fund to perform the work.

On a motion by Director Waters, seconded by Director Blois, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to approve the new capital project and estimated budget of \$250,000.

4. Discussion regarding approval of a financial contribution to professional services by Kennedy/Jenks Consultants to perform an alignment study for the Calleguas-Ventura Interconnection for an amount not-to-exceed \$213,472

The Manager of Engineering said that as discussed above, the City of Ventura is undertaking an alignment study for an Interconnection that will benefit the City, Calleguas, United, and Casitas. The City selected Kennedy/Jenks Consultants (K/J) to perform the work through a formal qualifications-based selection process; the Manager

of Engineering participated on the interview panel for the selection. The General Manager and Manager of Engineering have also participated in the development and refinement of the scope of work and will work with the other parties in the execution of the work.

The alignment study includes the following:

- Hydraulic modeling to determinate the connection point to Calleguas' system.
- Development and evaluation of alternative pipeline alignments.
- Pipeline, pump station, and pressure regulating station sizing and siting.
- Preparation of an Operation and Delivery Plan to describe potential operational scenarios.
- Water quality assessment.
- Right-of-way evaluation.
- Desktop geotechnical study.
- Preparation of an alignment study report.
- CEQA compliance (assumes preparation of an Environmental Impact Report will be necessary).
- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) compliance (if federal funding is sought).

The cost for professional services is reasonable for the work. As discussed above, Calleguas' contribution to the alignment study was calculated as 30% of the cost of the study. United is contributing 30% of the costs and the City is expected to cover the remainder. Per the explanation in the agenda item above, Calleguas would maintain the option to limit its financial contribution to \$52,885 (which covers only the early phases of the work) if the connection location at Springville Reservoir is selected. The City has requested that the General Manager issue a letter documenting Calleguas' financial commitment to the project.

On a motion by Director Blois, seconded by Director Slosson, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to approve the financial contribution and authorize the General Manager to issue a letter documenting Calleguas' financial commitment to the project.

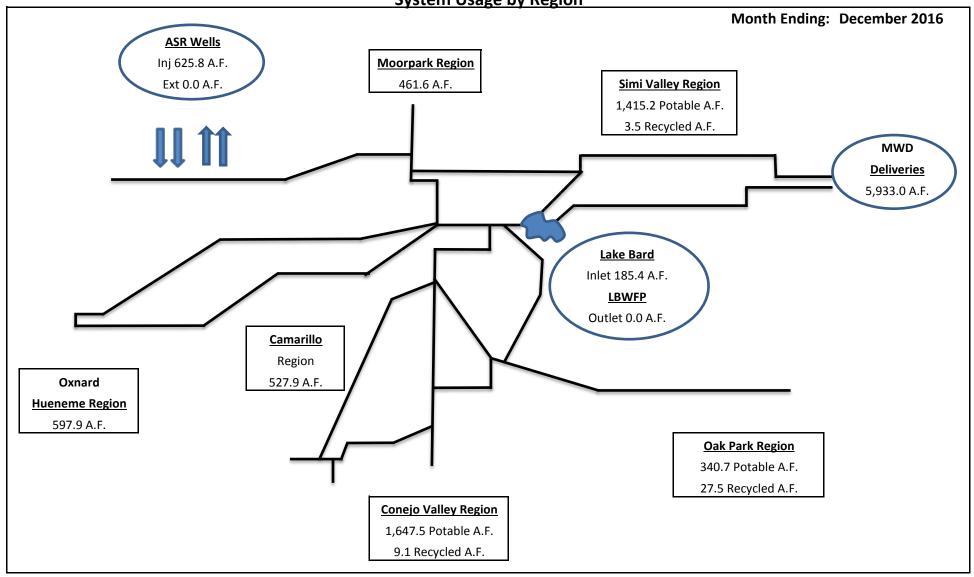

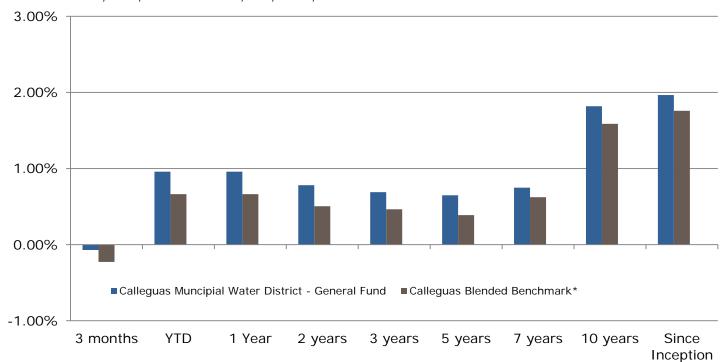

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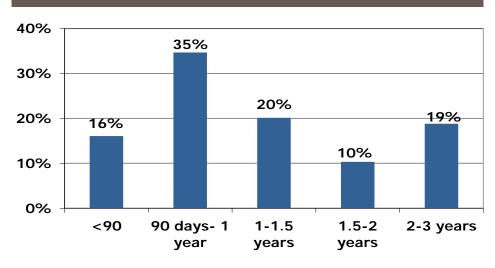

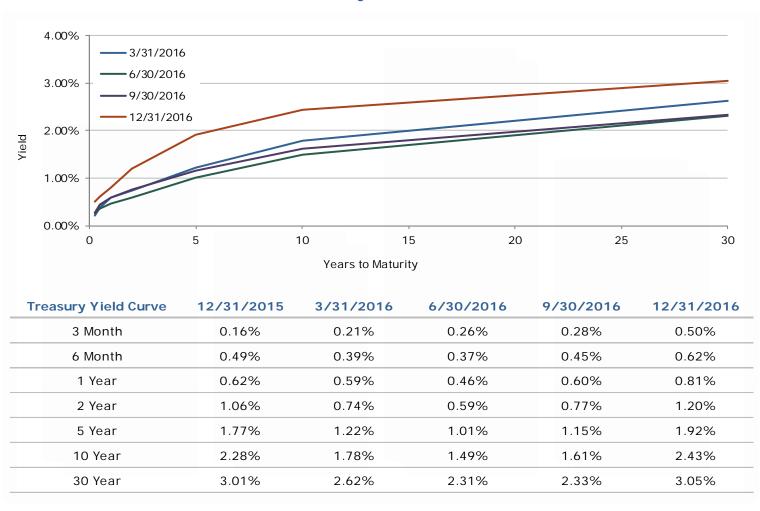

### **Treasury Yield Curve**



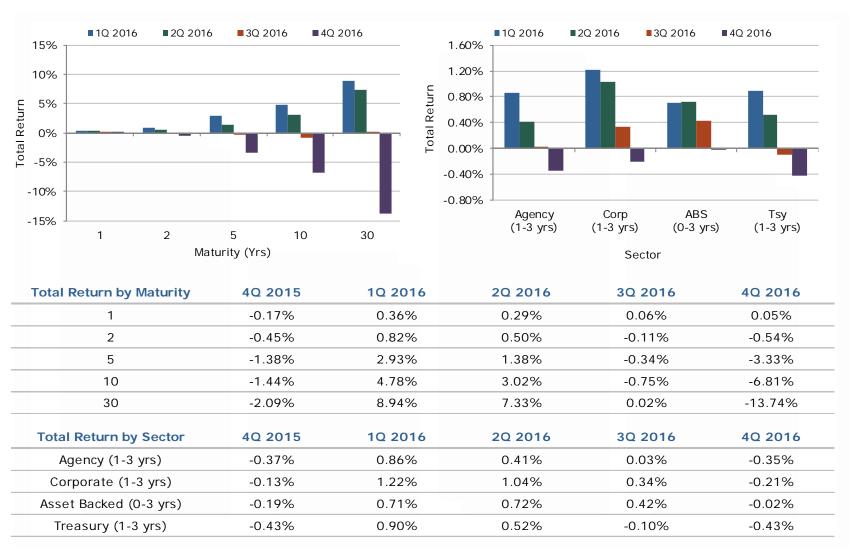

# IV. Investment Policy

# CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT INVESTMENT POLICY

#### 1. Basic Policy Statement

- a. The District's investment policy is intended to comply with Section 53600 et seq. of the Government Code and all applicable law. The District's investments shall be limited to investments approved by the Board of Directors as set forth herein.
- b. In order of importance, three fundamental criteria shall be followed in the investment program:
  - (1) Safety: Investments shall be made in a manner which first seeks to ensure the preservation of principal and accrued interest. To obtain this, diversification in types of investments will be required.
  - (2) Liquidity: Investments shall be made whose maturity date is compatible with cash flow requirements and which will permit easy and rapid conversion into cash minimizing the potential for loss of value.
  - (3) Return on Investment: Investments shall be made in a manner so as to produce an acceptable rate of return after; first, considering safety of principal and accrued interest, and second, liquidity.

#### 2. Investment Standard

When investing, reinvesting, purchasing, acquiring, exchanging, selling, or managing public funds all those responsible shall act with care, skill, prudence, and diligence under the circumstances then prevailing, including, but not limited to, the general economic conditions and the anticipated needs of the District, that a prudent person acting in a like capacity and familiar with those matters would use in the conduct of funds of a like character and with like aims, to safeguard the principal and maintain the liquidity needs of the District. Within the limitations of this section and considering individual investments as part of an overall strategy, investments may be acquired as authorized herein.

#### 3. Investment Management Service

The District has authorized the use of Investment Management Services for the District's Construction Fund and a portion of the District's General Funds. The District has retained Wells Capital Management as its Investment Manager. No investment management services may be utilized unless the Investment Manager agrees to follow the District's investment policy outlined herein and as directed by the Board. Wells Capital Management has agreed to follow the District's investment policy outlined in this document and as directed by the Board. Wells Capital Management is authorized by the Board to investments of the types described in item 4 below.

#### 4. Authorized Investments

- a. County of Ventura Investment Pool: Investment in the County of Ventura Investment Pool is not to exceed a maximum of fifteen million dollars. Should the District's holdings in the County of Ventura Investment Pool reach or exceed this set limit, the District will take immediate action to reduce the balance upon receipt of the monthly statement.
- b. Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF): The Local Agency Investment Fund has been established by the State Treasurer for the benefit of local agencies. The District may invest up to the maximum permitted by the LAIF.
- c. Collateralized Certificates of Deposit:. Certificates of deposit or "time deposits" of up to \$250,000 are federally insured. Beyond that amount, these CDs must be collateralized with the collateral held separately from the issuing institution. Statute does not limit CDs, however, this Investment Policy shall limit such investments to a maximum of 30 % of the portfolio and to a maximum of 15 % deposited in any one institution. In addition, time deposits shall be placed in institutions meeting all capital requirements and rated "AA" or higher by two of the three major rating agencies (Moody's, Standard & Poor's, and Fitch) for any deposits over \$250,000.
  - (1) Collateral is required to be deposited and is limited to the following:
    - (i)Mortgages/trust deeds valued at no less than one hundred fifty (150%) of the deposit amount; (or)
    - (ii)Eligible securities other than mortgages/trust deeds valued at no less that one hundred ten percent (110%) of the deposit amount.
  - (2) Pursuant to Government Code Section 53653, the first \$250,000 of collateral security may be waived if the institution is insured pursuant to Federal Law.
- d. Treasury Obligations: Direct obligations of the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America. There shall be no limitation as to the percentage of the portfolio invested in this category. The maturity on these investments shall not exceed five years without the prior approval of the Investment Committee.
- e. **Government Sponsored Enterprise (GSE) Securities**: The following Federal Agency Securities and Instruments of Government Sponsored Enterprises: maturities not exceeding five (5) years may be purchased from the following issuers:
  - (1) Federal Farm Credit System
  - (2) Federal Home Loan Bank System
  - (3) Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation (Freddie Mac)
  - (4) Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae)
  - (5) Federal Agriculture Mortgage Association (Farmer Mac)
  - (6) Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA)

There shall be no limitation as to the percentage of the portfolio invested in this category.

- f. Bankers Acceptances: Bills of exchange or time drafts drawn on and accepted by commercial banks, which are eligible for purchase by the Federal Reserve System, are known as banker's acceptances. Purchases of these instruments may not exceed 180 bankers days maturity. At the time of purchase, no more than 40% of the District's surplus funds may be invested in bankers' acceptances and no more than 5% of the District's surplus funds may be invested in bankers' acceptances from any one bank.
- g. Commercial Paper: Commercial paper which is rated at the time of purchase in the single highest classification by a nationally recognized rating service (for example, "A1" by Standard & Poor's or "P-1" by Moody's or "F-1" by Fitch). Purchases of commercial paper may not exceed 270 days maturity nor represent more than ten (10%) percent of the outstanding paper of an issuing corporation. At the time of purchase, no more than 25% of the District's surplus funds may be invested in commercial paper and no more than 5% of the District's surplus funds may be invested in any one issuer.
- h. Asset-backed Securities: As authorized in Government Code Section 53601(n), local agencies may invest in any equipment lease-backed certificate, consumer receivable pass-through certificate or consumer receivable-backed bond with a maximum remaining final maturity of five years.
  - Securities eligible for investment under this subdivision shall be rated "AAA" by a nationally recognized rating service. At the time of purchase, no more than 20% of the District's surplus funds may be invested in asset-backed/mortgage backed securities paper.
- i. **Mortgage-backed Securities**: As authorized in Government Code Section 53601(n), local agencies may invest in any mortgage pass-through security, collateralized mortgage obligation, mortgage-backed or other pay-through bond, with a maximum remaining final maturity of five years.
  - Securities eligible for investment under this subdivision shall be rated "AAA" by a nationally recognized rating service. At the time of purchase, no more than 20% of the District's surplus funds may be invested in asset-backed/mortgage backed securities.
- j. **Medium-term Notes**: As authorized in Government Code Section 53601(j), local agencies may invest in corporate notes issued by corporations organized and operating within the United States. Corporate notes eligible for investment shall have a rating of "A" or higher at time of purchase by a nationally recognized rating service. They shall have a maximum remaining maturity of no more than five (5) years after the date of purchase. Purchases of corporate notes may not exceed 30% of the District's portfolio. The maximum principal amount in any one company will not exceed 5% of the District's portfolio.

- k. **Money Market Funds**: Investments in a Money Market Fund rated "AAAm" or "Aaa" or better by Standard & Poor's or Moody's. Purchases of money market funds may not exceed 20% of the District's portfolio.
- I. **Investment Agreements**: Investment Agreements approved by the Board of Directors with notice to Standard & Poor's and Moody's.
- m. **Municipal Securities of Local Agencies** Debt securities issued by states, cities, counties and other governmental entities to fund day-to-day obligations and to finance capital projects. The purchase of municipal securities is a loan to the bond issuer in exchange for regular interest payments and the return of the original investment.
- n. Ineligible Investments: Investments not described herein, including but not limited to common stocks and financial futures contracts and options, are prohibited in this fund. Additionally, the District shall not invest in reverse floaters, range notes, or interest only strips that are derived from a pool of mortgages, nor may the District invest in any security that could result in zero interest accrued if held to maturity.

### 5. Credit Rating Services

The ratings published by the rating services recognized by the Securities and Exchange Commission's Nationally Recognized Statistical Rating Organizations (NRSRO) shall be used as a measure of the investment risk associated with an investment.

#### 6. Investment Committee

- a. The District authorizes the creation of an Investment Committee. The Investment Committee shall be comprised of the District's Treasurer, the General Manager, and the Manager of Finance. The Investment Committee shall make recommendations to the Board of Directors concerning investments and financial matters.
- b. The District's day-to-day administrative functions relating to the District's investments, including the deposit of funds and coordination and communication with the Investment Manager shall be the responsibility of the Manager of Finance under the direction of the General Manager. Non-routine decisions as to changes in investments and all decisions as to modifications to the District's investment policy shall be made by the Board of Directors with the advice and assistance of the Investment Committee.
- c. An emergency meeting of the Board of Directors will be called, whenever necessary, to deal with important investment issues which cannot await a regularly scheduled board meeting. In the event a quorum of the Calleguas Board of Directors cannot be obtained for the emergency meeting prior to the time a decision must be made, the Treasurer shall have the authority to make such emergency decisions as are necessary within the parameters of these guidelines and which are in the best interest of the District. In the event the Treasurer is unavailable, the President of the Board of Directors shall make any emergency decisions. Delegations of authority to the Treasurer shall be reviewed annually.

### 7. Amount on Deposit in Any One Institution

The Board of Directors will periodically review the magnitude of deposits held in any one financial institution. The amount that shall be deposited in any one banking institution shall not exceed the amount allowed by law.

#### 8. Term of Investment

The District and the Investment Manager are authorized to invest funds for terms authorized in accordance with the Government Code; provided that the maximum authorized term of an investment will not exceed three (3) years. Funds may be invested for longer terms, only if allowed by law and specifically approved by the Board of Directors.

#### 9. Qualifications of Brokers, Dealers, and Financial Institutions

This paragraph outlines the requirements necessary for selection of security dealers when the District makes investments not utilizing the Investment Manager named in paragraph 3 above. The District shall transact business only with banking institutions and with securities dealers. These securities dealers must be recognized primary dealers reporting to the New York Federal Reserve Bank and have offices located in the State of California. These dealers, or if unrated their parent company, must also maintain an "A-1/P-1" short-term credit rating. Any securities dealer interested in conducting business with the District is required to fill out the questionnaire maintained by the Manager of Finance. The Investment Committee shall review the information contained on the questionnaire and shall make such other investigation as they deem necessary to determine whether (1) the firm is adequately capitalized and meets the Federal Reserve's minimum capital requirements for broker/dealer operations, (2) the firm provides markets in securities appropriate to the District's investment policy. If these criteria are satisfied, the District is authorized to deal with the securities institution.

### 10. Reports

The Manager of Finance shall submit a monthly status report of investments to the Board of Directors. Deposits will be reported to the Board of Directors on a monthly basis.

#### 11. Review

The Investment Policy shall be reviewed annually and at such other times as the Board of Directors elects.

Dear Dan,

We are pleased to enclose the fourth quarter 2016 Review for the Calleguas Municipal Water District Short Duration portfolios managed by Wells Capital Management. We have also emailed you an electronic copy of the Q4 2016 Review to facilitate your review.

As we begin 2017, we offer our observations and thoughts about the economy and fixed income markets:

**Economy:** Year-end growth ended at a respectable, but unspectacular 2½% rate that is expected to be sustained (on average) through 2017. The economy will be caught between late-cycle restraints and remergence of an "old normal" economy, moving beyond the financial meltdown's after-shocks and more receptive to fiscal and regulatory support.

Moving the expansion to a firmer footing will be better-balanced growth between leading-edge consumer spending and housing vs. improving late-cycle investment and usually early-cycle manufacturing. Support will come less from rising operating rates than from a stabilizing oil industry, reaction to rising labor costs and weak productivity growth countering still-fragile overseas growth and the strong dollar's effect on U.S. competitiveness.

Beyond the growth cycle's age, fiscal and other stimulus could be undercut in the coming year by the Fed's tilt toward monetary restraint and by a potential conflict between Fed-induced increases in the dollar and the president-elect's trade policy keyed to export promotion and to a reduced trade deficit.

Three rate increases by the Federal Reserve and the economy's greater sensitivity to cyclical pressures will set the stage for a gradual, but sustained rise in U.S. interest rates during 2017, lifting the yield on the benchmark 10-year Treasury note by a projected half percentage point or less. More prominent downside risks to the rate outlook include a repeat of 2016's yield and flight-driven demand for U.S. securities, amid divergent central-bank policies and political risks here and abroad, plus dollar and oil-related restraint on inflation.

We summarize our economic 'big six' as follows:

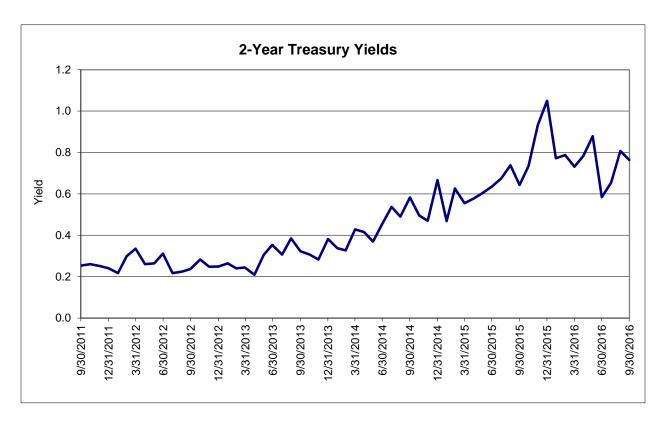
**Growth:** Acceleration ahead of significant fiscal policy shift

**Employment:** Job growth persists; slack diminishing **Inflation:** Core stable for now, expectations rising

Monetary: Quicker pace of tightening: 3-4 rate hikes in 2017

Fiscal: Tax cuts, more spending, wider deficits

**International:** Anti-globalization risk still rising in developed market countries



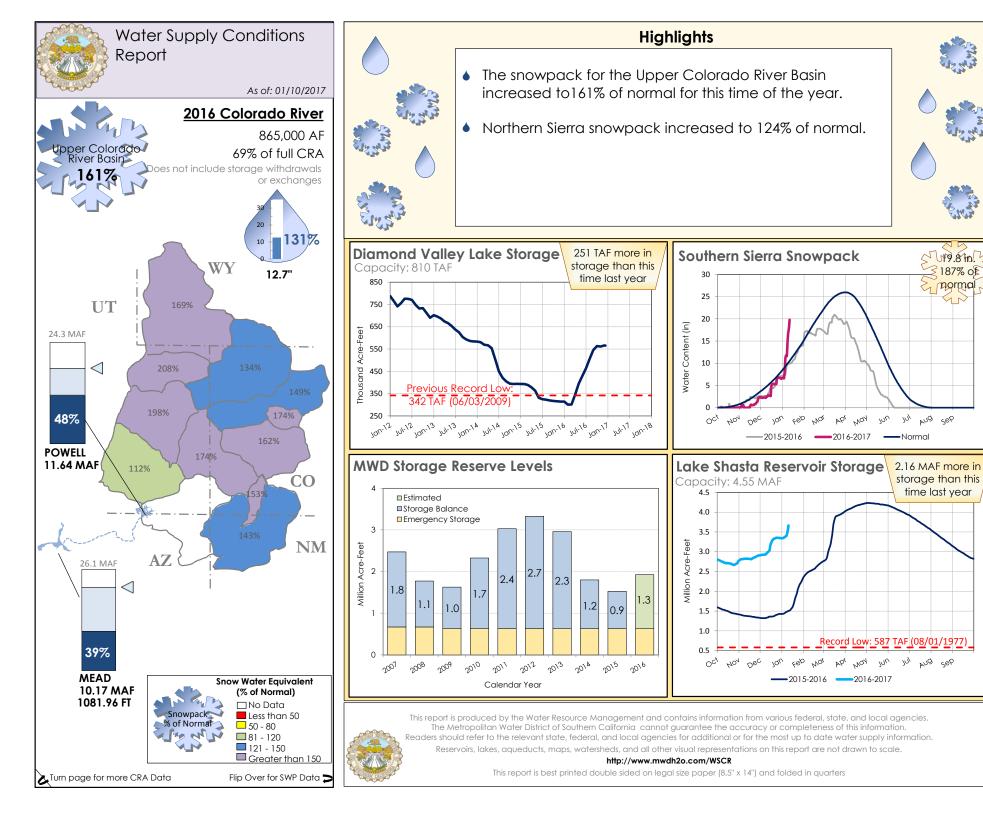
In the fourth quarter of 2017, the return for the Blended Treasury Index (40% Merrill Lynch 90-day US Treasury Bill Index and 60% Merrill Lynch 1-3 Year Treasury Index) was (-0.23%) versus CMWD's total return of (-0.07%). For the trailing 12-month period, the benchmark returned 0.66% against the combined portfolio return of 0.96% (gross of fees). A more detailed summary of the performance of each portfolio versus the benchmark is part of the book accompanying this letter.

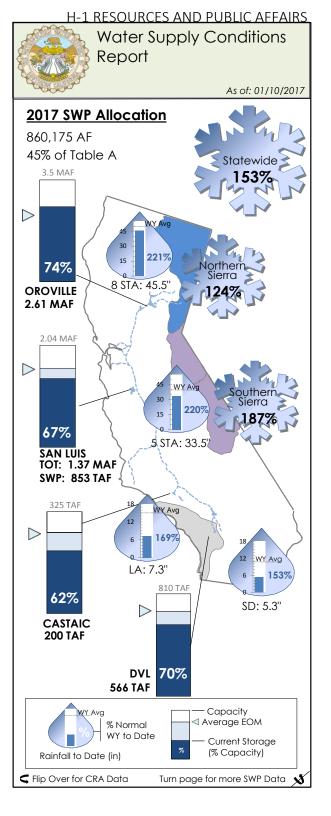

We appreciate the opportunity to work with the District in order to meet your investment objectives and welcome any questions that you or the Board or you may have regarding this material.

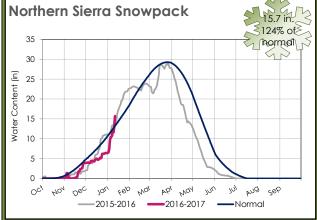

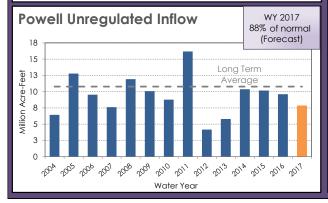
#### 2016 Colorado River Ag Use

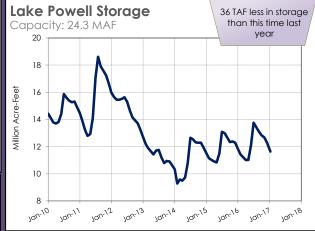


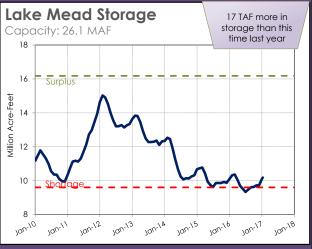

RESOLUTION OF THE VENTURA LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION MAKING DETERMINATIONS AND APPROVING THE CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT CHANGE OF ORGANIZATION — PLEASANT VALLEY VENTURE, LLC; ANNEXATION TO THE CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the above-referenced proposal has been filed with the Executive Officer of the Ventura Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo or Commission) pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (§ 56000 et seq. of the California Government Code); and

WHEREAS, notice was provided at the times and in the manner required by law; and WHEREAS, the proposal was duly considered on September 21, 2016; and WHEREAS, the Commission heard, discussed and considered all oral and written testimony for and against the proposal including, but not limited to, the LAFCo Staff Report

(which contains the recommendations and a discussion of applicable spheres of influence and local plans and policies); and

WHEREAS, all landowners within the affected territory have consented to the proposal; and

WHEREAS, the affected territory has fewer than twelve registered voters and is considered uninhabited; and

WHEREAS, information satisfactory to the Commission has been presented that no subject or affected agencies have submitted written opposition to the proposal; and

WHEREAS, the Commission finds the proposal to be in the best interest of the landowners and present and future inhabitants within the City of Oxnard (City) and within the affected territory, and the organization of local governmental agencies within Ventura County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Ventura Local Agency Formation Commission as follows:

(1) The LAFCo Staff Report dated September 21, 2016 and recommendation for approval of the proposal are adopted.

- (2) The change of organization is hereby approved, and the boundaries are established as generally set forth in the attached Exhibit A.
- (3) The boundaries of the proposal are found to be definite and certain as approved.
- (4) The subject proposal is assigned the following distinctive short form designation: LAFCO 16-05 CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT CHANGE OF ORGANIZATION – PLEASANT VALLEY VENTURE, LLC.
- (5) The Commission has reviewed and considered the information contained in the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) prepared by the City of Oxnard and the Addendum prepared by the Calleguas Municipal Water District and finds on the basis of the whole record before it that there is no substantial evidence that the Proposal will have a significant effect on the environment, and adopts the lead agency's mitigation measures and mitigation monitoring and reporting program set forth in Exhibit L of the MND.
- (6) The Commission directs staff to file a Notice of Determination in the same manner as a lead agency under CEQA Guidelines § 15094 and § 15096(i).
- (7) The affected territory is uninhabited as defined by Government Code § 56046.
- (8) Pursuant to Government Code § 56662(a), the territory is uninhabited, no affected local agency has submitted a written demand for notice and hearing, and all the owners of land within the affected territory have given their written consent to the proposal. The Commission hereby makes determinations upon the proposal without notice and hearing, and waives protest proceedings entirely.
- (9) The affected territory shall be liable for all taxes, charges, fees or assessments that are levied on similar properties within the District.
- (10) This reorganization shall not be recorded until all LAFCo fees have been paid and until fees necessary for filing with the State Board of Equalization have been submitted to the LAFCo Executive Officer.

- (11) This reorganization shall not be recorded until a map and legal description consistent with this approval and suitable for filing with the State Board of Equalization have been submitted to the LAFCo Executive Officer.
- (12) If a Certificate of Completion has not been filed within one year after the Commission's approval of the proposal, the proceeding shall be deemed terminated unless prior to the expiration of that year the Commission authorizes an extension of time for that completion (Government Code § 57001).

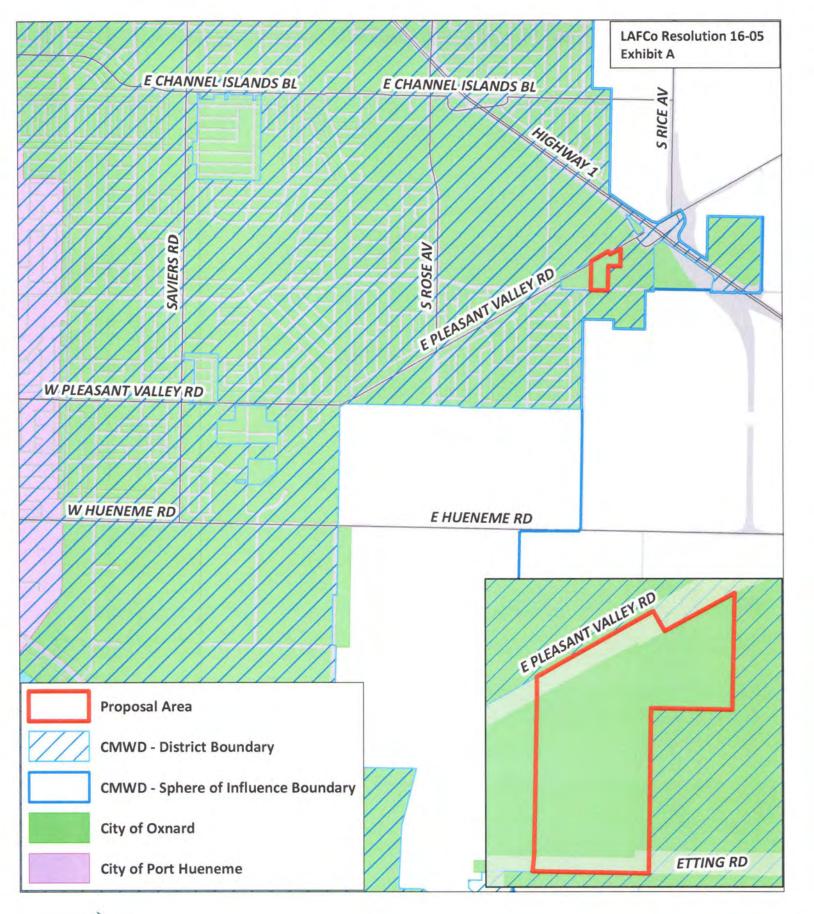

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CALLEGUAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT FOR ANNEXATION NO. 100

In the event of annexation, the annexation of the Property shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. In the event of annexation, the Proposed Annexee and the Property shall, within the time limits provided thereby, meet the terms and conditions, and pay such fees, as are imposed by The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan) for said annexation.
- 2. In the event of annexation, the Proposed Annexee and the Property shall, within the time limits provided thereby, meet the terms and conditions, and pay such fees, as are imposed or advanced by Calleguas Municipal Water District (Calleguas) for said annexation.
- 3. In the event of annexation, the sale and delivery of all water by Calleguas, the release of water, the cost of the water, and the time of use of water shall be subject to the regulations promulgated from time to time by Calleguas and Metropolitan.
- 4. In the event of annexation, all feeder pipelines, structures, connections, and other facilities required for the delivery of water to said area from works owned or operated by Calleguas shall be constructed, provided and installed without cost or expense to Calleguas, and Calleguas shall be under no obligation to provide, construct, operate or maintain such works.
- 5. If construction of water distribution facilities is required to properly effect water services to the Property, all such costs shall be borne by the Proposed Annexee and all facilities constructed shall, at the election of Calleguas, be owned, maintained, and operated by Calleguas. Design of such facilities shall be subject to pre-approval by Calleguas.
- 6. Except upon terms and conditions specifically approved by the Board of Directors of Calleguas, water sold and delivered by Calleguas shall not be used in any manner which intentionally or avoidably results in the direct or indirect benefit of areas outside Calleguas.
- 7. The Proposed Annexee has been advised of Calleguas' Capital Construction Charge (Ordinance No. 14).

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Calleguas Municipal Water District ("Calleguas"), a municipal water district situated in the county of Ventura, State of California, pursuant to Resolution No. 1885, in accordance with the provisions of the Metropolitan Water District Act (MWD Act), has applied to the Board of Directors of The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan) for consent to annex thereto certain uninhabited territory situated in the county of Ventura referred to as Annexation No. 100, more particularly described in an application to the Ventura County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO), concurrently with the annexation thereof to Calleguas, such annexation to Metropolitan to be upon such terms and conditions as may be fixed by the Board of Directors of Metropolitan;

WHEREAS, the owner of Ventura County Assessor Parcel Numbers 225-0-014-165 and 225-0-014-190 (Property) has applied for annexation into Calleguas and Metropolitan;

WHEREAS, completion of said annexation shall be contingent upon approval by the LAFCO;

WHEREAS, completion of said annexation shall be further contingent upon LAFCO conditioning its approval of the Annexation No. 100 upon a requirement that Metropolitan's existing and established taxes, benefit assessments, or property-related fees or charges in place in the service area are levied or fixed and collected on the parcels being annexed to the agency; these taxes, benefit assessments, or property-related fees or charges are identified below;

WHEREAS Metropolitan has levied and collected ad valorem taxes on parcels within the territory of Calleguas. Such charges for fiscal year 2016/17 are described in Resolution 9210, adopted by Metropolitan's Board on August 16, 2016;

WHEREAS, since fiscal year 1992/93, Metropolitan has levied and collected water standby charges pursuant to Section 134.5 of the MWD Act on parcels within the territory of Calleguas. Such charges for fiscal year 2016/17 are described in Resolution 9208, adopted by Metropolitan's Board on May 10, 2016;

WHEREAS, upon annexation, the parcels will be within Metropolitan's service area, Metropolitan water will be available to such parcels and such parcels will receive the benefit of the projects provided in part with proceeds of Metropolitan's water standby charges;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), County of Ventura, acting as Lead Agency, adopted the Coastal Apartment Homes Project and Coastal Senior/Assisted Living Projet (Project) Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND), and Mitigation Monitoring Reporting Program (MMRP) and approved the Project on May 18, 2016 for the development of the proposed annexation parcels, and Metropolitan, acting as Responsible Agency under CEQA, is required to certify that it has reviewed and considered the information contained in the MND and MMRP prior to approval of the formal terms and conditions for Annexation No. 100; and

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board of Directors that such application should be granted, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of Metropolitan, acting as Responsible Agency, has reviewed and considered the information in the MND and MMRP prior to the approval of the terms and conditions for Annexation No. 100; and subject to the following terms and conditions, does hereby grant the application of the governing body of Calleguas for consent to annex Annexation No. 100 to Metropolitan and does hereby fix the terms and conditions of such annexation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of Metropolitan, subject to the following terms and conditions, does hereby grant the application of the governing body of Calleguas for consent to Annexation No. 100 to Metropolitan and does hereby fix the terms and conditions of such annexation:

Section 1. The annexation of said area to Calleguas shall be made concurrently with the annexation thereof to Metropolitan, and all necessary certificates, statements, maps, and other documents required to be filed by or on behalf of Calleguas to effectuate the annexation shall be filed on or before December 31, 2017.

Section 2. Prior to filing a request for a Certificate of Completion of the annexation proceedings with LAFCO, Calleguas shall submit a certified copy of LAFCO's resolution approving the annexation to Calleguas, and shall pay to Metropolitan \$41,920.50 for its annexation fee, if the annexation is completed by December 31, 2016. If the annexation is completed during the 2017 calendar year, the annexation charge will be calculated based on the then-current rate, in accordance with Metropolitan's Administrative Code Section 3300.

Section 3. a. Metropolitan shall be under no obligation to provide, construct, operate, or maintain feeder pipelines, structures, connections, and other facilities required for the delivery of water to said area from works owned and operated by Metropolitan.

- b. Calleguas shall not be entitled to demand that Metropolitan deliver water to Calleguas for use, directly or indirectly, within said area, except for domestic or municipal use therein.
- c. The delivery of all water by Metropolitan, regardless of the nature and time of use of such water shall be subject to the water service regulations, including rates and charges promulgated from time to time by Metropolitan.
- d. The delivery of all water by Metropolitan, regardless of the nature and time of use of such water shall be subject to the water service regulations, including rates and charges promulgated from time to time by Metropolitan.
- e. Except upon the terms and conditions specifically approved by the Board of Directors of Metropolitan, water sold and delivered by Metropolitan shall not be used in any manner which intentionally or avoidably results in the direct or indirect benefit of areas outside Metropolitan, including use of such water outside Metropolitan or use thereof within Metropolitan in substitution for other water outside Metropolitan.
- Section 4. LAFCO has conditioned approval of the annexation upon a requirement that Metropolitan levy or fix and collect all previously established and collected taxes, benefit assessments, or property-related fees or charges on parcels being annexed to the agency.
- Section 5. Such charges, which are subject to change over time, include but are not limited to:
- a. Metropolitan's ad valorem tax on properties located within the territory of Calleguas. Metropolitan shall levy the ad valorem tax in the amount, at the same time and in the same manner as ad valorem tax on other properties located within the territory of Calleguas. Such charges for fiscal year 2016/17 are 0.0035 percent of the assessed value of each parcel, as described in Resolution 9210, adopted by Metropolitan's Board on August 16, 2016.
- b. Metropolitan's water standby charge on properties located within the territory of Calleguas. Metropolitan shall levy the water standby charge in the amount, at the same time and in the same manner as water standby charges on other properties located within the territory of Calleguas. Such charges for fiscal year 2016/17 are \$9.58 per acre of land, or per parcel of land less than an acre, as described in Resolution 9208, adopted by Metropolitan's Board on May 10, 2016.
- Section 6. That the General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary action to secure the collection of the ad valorem taxes and water standby charges by the appropriate county officials, including payment of the reasonable cost of collection.

Section 7. That the Board of Directors of Metropolitan, acting as Responsible Agency, has reviewed and considered the information in the MND and MMRP prior to approval of the terms and conditions for Annexation No. 100; and subject to the following terms and conditions, does hereby grant the application of the governing body of Calleguas for consent to annex Annexation No. 100 to Metropolitan and does hereby fix the terms and conditions of such annexation;

Section 8. That the General Manager and General Counsel are hereby authorized to do all things necessary and desirable to accomplish the purposes of this resolution, including, without limitation, the commencement of defense of litigation.

Section 9. That if any provision of this resolution or the application to any member agency, property or person whatsoever is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application, and to that end the provisions of this resolution are severable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board Executive Secretary is directed to transmit forthwith to the governing body of Calleguas a certified copy of this resolution.

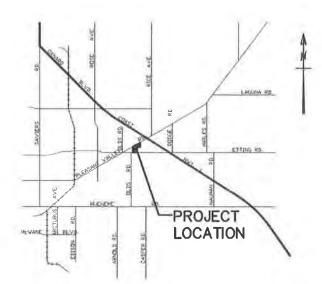

METROPOLITAN STUDY DEMONSTRATES FEASIBILITY OF LARGE-SCALE REGIONAL RECYCLING WATER PROGRAM Program developed in collaboration with LA County Sanitation Districts would produce enough water to serve 335,000 homes

A new study has confirmed the feasibility of a proposed large-scale project to treat and purify wastewater and distribute it to groundwater basins across the region through a collaboration between the Metropolitan Water District and the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County.

The conclusion of the feasibility study paves the way for the next step—the construction of a demonstration facility, which could begin this summer.

"We are very excited this program is moving closer to reality," Metropolitan General Manager Jeffrey Kightlinger said. "With drought, climate change and environmental restrictions changing the way we manage water, we are committed to developing and investing in new local sources of water to supplement the region's other supplies.

"This program is one part of the region's comprehensive effort to increase water supplies that are drought-proof and climate-resilient. And it complements the many other solutions we are working on," Kightlinger said.

Through the Regional Recycled Water Program, Metropolitan would take wastewater treated at the Sanitation Districts' Joint Water Pollution Control Plant in Carson—water that is currently treated and discharged into the ocean—and purify it using reverse osmosis and other processes. These treatment technologies have been used for decades in California and across the globe and produce high-quality water that meets all state and federal standards.

The purified water would then be stored in four groundwater basins in Los Angeles and Orange counties, allowing for additional natural filtration. Those basins, which serve 7.2 million people, are currently recharged with local rainwater, water imported from the Colorado River and Northern California and, in some cases, recycled water.

Recharging these basins with recycled water from a project developed by Metropolitan would make imported water available for other uses, including storage for future droughts and emergencies. And it would create greater recharge stability. In recent years, basin levels have reached historic lows due to impacts from the drought, which limited imported supplies available for recharge.

"Southern California's ongoing drought is a reminder that water is too precious to use just once," Kightlinger said. "We've done a great job conserving water—per capita water use in Southern California has declined about 25 percent since 1990—but our population continues to grow and our economy continues to expand. That means we have to continue investing in new ways to use the water we have as efficiently as possible and find multiple ways to diversify our resource portfolio."

The estimated construction cost of the program is \$2.7 billion, including building an advanced treatment facility in Carson and laying 60 miles of pipelines to the groundwater basins. Annual operations and maintenance costs are estimated at about \$129 million. That means the water produced by the program would cost approximately \$1,600 an acre-foot—competitive with other new local supplies.

The program would produce up to 150 million gallons of purified water per day, enough water to serve more than 335,000 homes.

While the feasibility study results are encouraging, additional detailed studies are needed before a final decision is made to move forward with a full-scale program.

Metropolitan is in the process of completing the design of a demonstration facility that will allow the agencies to further test, monitor and optimize the treatment process. The 500,000-gallon-a-day facility would be operated for at least one year.

The full-scale program would then be designed, built and launched over subsequent years.

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The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California is a state-established cooperative of 26 cities and water agencies serving nearly 19 million people in six counties. The district imports water from the Colorado River and Northern California to supplement local supplies, and helps its members to develop increased water conservation, recycling, storage and other resource-management programs.
